We are going to reach the end on Palm Sunday, as Jesus enters Jerusalem and begins his journey to the cross and beyond.

This is another book of the Bible which is a challenge to read, but then it would not be a Lenten challenge if there was not some sort of sacrifice in what we were doing! However, you are not reading this alone! As we go through, there will be some notes available each week (released each Wednesday via YouTube, Bromley URC's website and on paper if requested).
